Congratulations to the BOI Class of 2007!

100% successfully obtained the Baccalauréat and are now continuing, or planning to continue, their studies in higher education.

About 32% of the class were accepted into selective and demanding CPGE programmes, the Classes Préparatoires aux Grandes Ecoles:
